Literacy

- To create a subheading.
- To write subheadings as a question. E.g. How do they celebrate in China?
- I can organise information under subheadings
- I can use conjunctions to extend my sentences, (because and but so)

Maths

- To recall number bonds to 10, 20 and 100 for both addition and subtraction.
- To add and subtract a two-digit and single digit number. E.g. 37—5 = 32 65—4 = 61
- To add and subtract a two-digit and an amount of 10s. E.g. 34 + 20 = 54 34-20 = 14
- To add and subtract two two-digit numbers.
- To add three one- digit numbers. E.g. 2 + 4 + 6 = 12
- To understand that addition is commutative but subtraction must start with th largest number. Eq. 30+4=34 4+30=34 34-30=4 34-4=30

To use simple compass directions (North, South, East and West) and locational and directional language (E.g. example, near and far; left and right), to describe the location of features on a map.

To use aerial photographs and plan perspectives to recognise landmarks and basic human and physical features.

Music

Use their voices expressively and creatively by singing songs and speaking chants and rhyme.

PE

To perform dances using simple movement patterns.

To recognise similarities and differences between Christian and Jewish celebrations.

To make links between their own and other's experiences. E.g. Celebrating Christmas (Christianity) and Hanukkah (Judaism)

To learn about how the internet and digital devices can be used safely to find things out and to communicate with

To understand basic rules to keep safe online, including what is meant by personal information and what should be kept private; the importance of telling a trusted adult if they come across something that scares them.

Literacy

We will create a passport to visit the continents of the world.

We will explore the continents of the world to investigate what people eat, celebrate on different continents.

We will listen to music around the world.

We will explore the landmarks from different continents.

E.g. The Colosseum in Rome, Italy.

History

Understand the role of the King, the Government and the People and sequence the story of the Gunpowder Plot.

Investigate and explore the effect of the Gunpowder Plot in the 17th century and

Create a Fact File on Significant Figures within the Gunpowder Plot and a 'Wanted' poster for Guy Fawkes.

Create a timeline marking key events leading up to and of the Gunpowder Plot. Debate whether Guy Fawkes was a Hero or a Villain Write a newspaper report about the Gunpowder Plot.

Geography

We will use world maps, atlases and globes to identify the United Kingdom and its countries, as well as the countries, continents and oceans

We will interpret maps to give simple compass directions (North, South, East and West) and locational and directional language (E.g. example, near and far; left and right), to describe the location of features on a map.

We will use aerial photographs and plan perspectives to recognise landmarks and basic human and physical features.

E.g. Where is London? Where are the Houses of Parliament?

Where is Europe? Where is Italy? Where is the Colosseum landmark?
