Breakfast club changes from September 2024

Due to our wonderful breakfast club staff moving on to new opportunities, and to avoid any disruption or cancellation of our breakfast club and valued wraparound care service, from September we will be partnering with 'Progressive Kids' to run our

breakfast club. Progressive kids is currently providing quality wrap-around care in over 200 schools nationwide, and has been doing so for over 20 years. It will, therefore, be able to continue to provide a welcoming and enjoyable breakfast club for all of our pupils. All its staff are fully trained in the necessary areas (Early Years, First Aid, Food Hygiene, Safeguarding etc.) and will be working closely with our staff team to ensure a seamless handover. The club will continue to run from our Nursery building.

Because of this, there will be a number of changes to how the club runs and can be booked:

- Breakfast club will now start at **7:30am** (an earlier start we hope will help some families even more)
- The charge for this club will increase to £4 a session, with a 10% sibling discount.
- Breakfast club needs to be booked directly with Progressive Kids (the link can be found on the accompanying letter). This link will also ask you for your child's emergency contact details and medical information etc. If you are struggling to book via this link, please call Progressive Kids who can help you sign up.
- Communication regarding breakfast club needs to be directly with Progressive Kids.
- Childcare vouchers can continue to be used to pay for sessions.

We do understand that this is a new way of working. We shall, therefore, support families in order to make sure that they can book onto the club successfully, and that their wrap-around care is not affected.

Attached to this newsletter is a letter from Progressive Kids giving further information about the club. Staff from Progressive Kids will also be holding a parent meeting in school on **5th July at 3:15pm** for families who wish to find out more. During this meeting families can be shown how to sign up for breakfast club.



Transition plans

As we approach the summer holidays, and the end of the year, we also start looking forward to what September will bring. Today you will have received a letter telling you who your child's class teacher will be next year. Along with our transition day, we have a range of transition plans in place to support your children as they move into the next year group. Children in Nursery, F2 and year 1 will also welcome a surprise "secret storyteller" to their classroom (who will be their new class teacher!). Additional classroom visits will also take place over the final few weeks during the school day to help children adjust to the changes.

Transition day - Wednesday 10th July

This day will be our whole school transition day, where children will spend the day with their new teachers in their new classrooms. Children will need to be dropped off and collected from their new classrooms on this day.

For children transitioning from our nursery to F2, this day will be spent in the F2 building, with children completing their normal nursery sessions there. They will need to be dropped off and collected at their normal session times from the F2 building. Children who do not usually attend nursery on this day, are invited to join us if they would like to. Please speak with the nursery staff about this.

For children transitioning to year 3 at Halfway Junior School, this day will be spent at the Junior School and **children will** need to be dropped off (8:40am) and collected (3:10pm) from there.

- Wednesday 17th July Nursery end of year 'Teddy Bears Picnic'
- \Rightarrow Parents do not attend this event.

NEW Breakfast Club from September 2024!

Dear Parents/Guardian,


